Dark red color. The aroma profile is comprised of fruit, floral, and spice. While shy at first this youthful Pinot Noir blend shows red cherry, anise, lemon-zest, crème brulee, and boysenberry. After some time, notes of violets, jasmine, and cloves round out the profile. As this wine flows into the palate these profiles remain consistent and equal in balance. The mouthfeel showcases a voluptuous and lively touch, while maintaining harmony with intensity of texture and flavors. This youthful, plush, and hedonistic blend should continue to deliver enjoyment for many years to come.


excited, as we all were at this same time of life. It is hard to believe that both Claire and her brother Nick are college graduates and off into the world starting and advancing their careers!

Floral aromas of raspberry and cherry are complicated by rose, cinnamon and pungent herbs. Gains weight and flesh with ai, with no loss of clarity or verve. Silky tannins add shape to the long, spicy finish, which echoes the floral note. Distinctly elegant pinot, with some time to unwind.

A gorgeous, rich and layered effort that knocks it out of the park with its cassis and blackberry, vanilla bean and licorice aromas and flavors. Medium to full-bodied and concentrated, with great texture, it should evolve nicely for just under a decade.

# 2013 93 POINTS/ROBERT PARKER

Another fresh, lively, medium to full-bodied effort. Cassis, black raspberry, sappy underbrush and spice-box all flow from this pure, lively and balanced 2013, and it has nicely integrated tannin and good acidity. Drink it anytime over the coming 6-7 years.

Infused with a wealth of very rich oak, it remains solidly fruity throughout its length, and, while a big, mouthfilling wine of immense stuffing, it is certain to improve for many years. Its riveting richness will be met by refinement as time slowly passes

It teases with succulent cherries on the nose and what follows on the palate is a very solid, impeccably balanced wine that lives up to its aromatic promises of purity and depth, but is still in its infancy and demanding of age.
